
Bexar County Population


2,115,325 people resided in Bexar County in 2024, making it the state's fourth most populous county. With a population that is 60% (1,277,287 people) Hispanic, it is Texas' most populous majority-Hispanic county and the third-largest nationwide. Nearly 15% (305,602) of residents live below the poverty line, which is 10% higher than the rate in Texas and 20% higher than the national rate. There are vast social, economic and health disparities that exist across Bexar County, including poverty rates, disease prevalence and life expectancy.






Distribution of Residents by ZIP Code¹






University Health Patients, 2024


269,057 unique patients had a hospitalization, office visit, ED visit and/or a hospital encounter at University Health in 2024. Most of these patients (74% or 198,209) were seen at an office visit. University Health has a higher percentage of Hispanic patients and patients who reside in an area of high social vulnerability than Bexar County.

Race/Ethnicity






Distribution of Patients by ZIP Code




